Waiheke High School Uniform

Jumpers & Jackets—the school Uniform shop has available a very warm dark blue jacket, a blue jumper with school logo and a polar fleece with school logo. These are the only jackets and jumpers permitted.

Shoes must be predominantly black and socks can be black or white. Black sports shoes with some colour and sports socks are appropriate. Stockings/Tights black only. Uniform and shoes must be clean and tidy.

Earrings are to be studs or small sleepers (plugs not acceptable). Wristwatch and a taonga can be worn by students where this is culturally appropriate.

Hair must be clean and well groomed.

Make up (including nail polish) should be subtle and not noticeable.

The PE shirt or a plain white t-shirt may be worn underneath the school shirt, in this case the sleeves and the lower portion of the garment must not be visible. All except the top button should be fastened on school shirts. Skirts and shorts are to be an appropriate length – no shorter than three to five centimetres above the knee. Plain dark blue hats (not shown) may be worn for sun protection and not in class.

Auckland Transport is proposing changes to the routes and timetables for Waiheke public bus services. Feedback on these proposed changes is open from 19 March to 20 April 2018. We want as many Waiheke residents, other property owners and visitors as possible to have their say about the proposed new routes and timetables.

We have produced a FREEPOST information brochure and feedback form which will be posted in the week beginning Monday 19 March. It will be sent to every household on the island and to those with an island property who live elsewhere. Feedback can also be given online at: www.at.govt.nz/ newnetworkwaiheke.

The proposed new routes and timetables have been developed in consultation with the Local Board and the Waiheke bus company. But they are *proposals* so public feedback is critical to help us make the right decisions.

Although there are no changes to school buses, your staff, students and their families will probably use public buses around the island.




















CALLING ALL YOUNG POETS!
