Junior Arts Department

Year 9 and Year 10 exhibits in the 'Reclaim to Fame' Exhibition, at the Waiheke Community Art Gallery 19th November – 13 December







Our Year 9 and 10 Art classes are currently exhibiting small sculptures at the Waiheke community Art Gallery in the 'Reclaim to Fame' exhibition.

The Year 9 works are small papier mache and plaster reliefs built on mussel shells, which are a response to Dick Frizzell's appropriation of the Hei Tiki and Pop Art; some works are recognizable cartoon characters wearing the moko or have koru patterns as part of their composition.

The Year 10 works consist mainly of upcycled picnic paper cups, plates and wooden cutlery (all hopefully biodegradable) created with a theme based on the human figure, in response to a one-hour sculpture workshop. The resulting small sculptures seem to have unique personalities and all students had fun making them.

There is also a little group of upcycled works featuring a figure created from a kitchen grater, by Ambrose Burke-Munns, a teddy bear inspired sculpture by Ruby Davidson, a mother and child work created from an old candlestick by Kara Boal-Smith and two action figures by Cole Annabel and Miles Mason. Jack Shirley has also created an unusual reclining figure with fireball.
