


Kia ora koutou,

Important Career Dates for 2021

At Waiheke High School, our students are fortunate enough to have access to DreamCatcher, an online career management tool. This career planning portfolio stays with them until they leave school. Students use Dream-Catcher to set goals, input work experience, and research occupations. They are able to save information about jobs and where to train beyond school.

We provide students with a range of career exploration opportunities including our Year 8 Career Day, Year 9 and 10 career lessons, Year 12 and 13 Taster Days, Careers Evening, Gateway work experience, senior interviews, and STAR short courses.

Careers Evening (Wednesday 30 June): Parents/caregivers and students Year 10 -13 invited.

Career Taster Days: Students try out a job of interest for a day. Year 13 = Wednesday 23 June Year 12 = Friday 25 June

Career Awareness Days:

Self-assessments, career research, speakers, CV building, and networking. Year 8 = Thursday 1 April Year 11 = Wednesday 23 June Year 12 = Thursday 24 June Year 13 = Friday 25 June

Conservation Dog Visit



Te Korowai o Waiheke is excited to be hosting Miriam Ritchie with three of her conservation dogs at the Ostend market this Saturday March 20th from 9am to 10:30am.

Miriam is a trainer/handler, certifier & mentor of pest detection dogs in the Conservation Dogs Programme NZ, run by DOC. She's been involved in most of the island pest eradications around NZ for the last 18 years, doing post eradication monitoring with her dogs. Three years ago she took two of her dogs to South Georgia, to do the post eradication monitoring after their rodent eradication, which is the biggest successful rodent eradication in the world so far - a very exciting project to be involved in.

Students and others are welcome to come along and meet Miriam and the dogs and ask questions about the work they do.
