NCEA Examination Information for Parents

1 – The students have been given a comprehensive information sheet about all the key aspects of the external examinations.

2 – Please make sure students know the correct date and time of their examination.

3 – They have been given their ADMISSION SLIPS – they must have these for the examinations. They will NOT be allowed into the examinations without it. If they lose it, they must get another one printed and signed by Mr Kennedy or Ms Curreen.

For Scholarship examinations they must also have photo ID.

4 – They have had the rules regarding the NCEA examinations explained to them – these rules MUST be followed at all times.

NCEA EXAMINATION – RULES FOR CANDIDATES

Key Points

- Arrive at least 20-30 mins before the exam.
- Make sure they have their admission slip.
- Make sure they have the correct equipment needed for the exam, including more than one pen. All equipment must be in a see-through plastic bag.
- Follow the instructions of the examination supervisors AT ALL TIMES.
- Do NOT bring into the examination – paper, electronic devices, watches, notes in any form.

5 – Derived Grade

Students may apply for a derived grade if:

- They are sick, had an accident, or there was some special situation beyond their control.
- If any of these reasons have impaired, or stopped the student from sitting the examination they MUST collect a 'Derived grade application form' from the office and return it to the school, with any supporting evidence ASAP.
- If they are sick, it is advisable to collect the form BEFORE they go to the doctor, so the doctor and complete the required section/s.

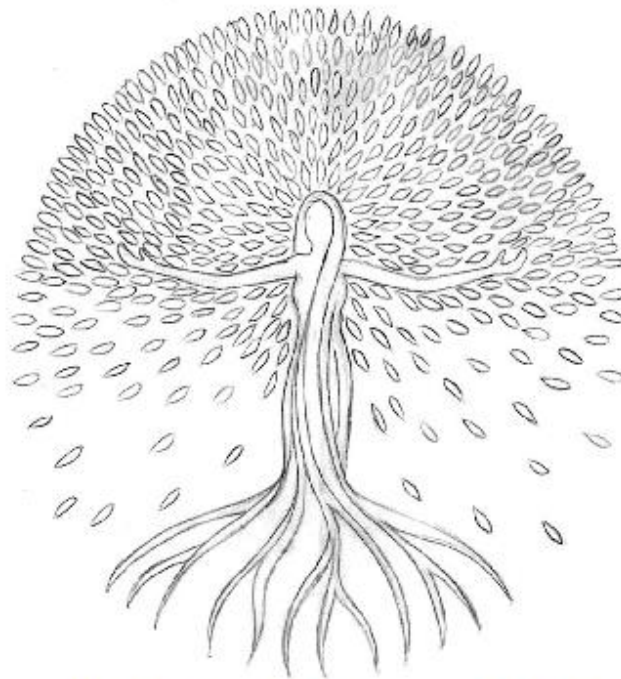
