AIMS Games 2018





Waiheke High School students were treated to six sunny days in Tauranga for the 2018 Anchor AIMS Games. They were some of the 10, 800 athletes taking part in the largest sporting event for 11-13-year-olds in the Southern Hemisphere

Waiheke High School took three teams down to the AIMS Games. The AIMS Games is a sports competition for intermediate aged students. It is comprised of close to 11, 000 competitors from 320 schools competing in 22 different sports. There were teams from throughout New Zealand, Tonga and the Cook Islands.

This was a fantastic opportunity for the students to compete in what felt like a mini Olympics. The event started on Sunday with an Opening Ceremony at Mount Maunganui's ASB Arena. There were 5000 people at the Opening Ceremony who were entertained by kapa haka, dance and singing performances as well speeches by Paralympic gold medallist swimmer Nikita Howarth and dual Olympic gold medallist shot putter Dame Valerie Adams.

The tournament ran for five days. Our hockey, football and netball teams competed. There was some very tough competition throughout the week with some very high calibre teams and athletes. The Netball team finished with 6 losses and 5 wins placing them 105th out of 122 teams. The hockey team placed 48th and the football team placed 32nd.

The students represented Waiheke with pride and on a number of times were commended for their sportsmanship by the referees and opposing coaches. We are very fortunate to have taken part and I'm sure that this is an event these young students will remember for the rest of their lives. Dear Property Owner/Resident.

Kennedy Point Ferry Terminal - Construction Works.

As you may be aware, Auckland Transport have a number of works planned for the Kennedy Point Ferry Terminal over the coming years.

These works are designed to repair or replace ageing structures to ensure that the Kennedy Point terminal continues to cater for residents and visitors and to ensure the terminal's operational capability continues well into the future

In order to keep disruption at Kennedy Point to a minimum the works will be completed in 3 stages outside of the main peak summer season.

Whilst winter works in the marine environment presents challenges and risks, Auckland Transport remain fully cognoscente of the primary link to the mainland that the Kennedy Point Ferry Terminal provides for local residents and visitors to Waiheke Island.

- Stage 1 The reconstruction of the currently redundant western ramp Sept 2018 Dec 2018.

 This will provide alternate berthage for bulk material vessels during the Stage 2 works whilst also adding much-needed additional berthage for a variety of larger vessels for the future.
- Stage 2 The reconstruction of the main wharf structure March 2019 Dec 2019.
 The reconstruction of the main wharf retaining structure. This will ensure the wharf continues to provide appropriate facilities for all terminal users for the next 40-50 years.
- Stage 3 Roading and street lighting improvements post completion of Stage 2 (exact timing TBC).
 Repairs and upgrade of the ferry terminal road and surfacing to meet the needs of modern traffic and heavy vehicles.
