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41	 The drinking water for WHS comes from 2 bores and a combined tank farm with Te Huruhi
42	Primary School. (Te Huruhi also collects roof water). The water flows between these 2
43	supplies but this has now been cut off.
44	Bores closed off.
45	No roof water being used at present.
46	 Only water being used at the moment is being brought onto the site.
47	The Ministry will be covering all costs that arise from these water issues.
48	WHS now has 3 clear tests but testing will continue in the meantime. Does not appear to
49	be further contamination.

51	 When e-coli first found the school community was informed immediately.

- The MOE started immediate engineering reviews once they were informed of the contamination as contractors were already onsite looking at the bore at the time.
 - Contractors working currently to replace all in ground reticulation.
 - Varying qualities of tanks onsite and intention is to replace each tank. It is Alex's opinion that all our tanks will need replacing.
 - UV and water filtration systems have been replaced. These work in tandem/same process at Te Huruhi.
 - Yes the water is safe but the temporary drinking water will still be brought onsite for the time being. Bottled water will also be brought onsite as a backup for any children who do forgot bottles.
 - Tanks most likely PVC tanks for the new tanks. Tanks that still require use in the meantime have been cleaned.
 - New drinking fountains will be installed.
 - Showers in the Recreation Centre are running from the current water onsite and that water has been tested and is clear. Students have been advised that they should not open their mouths when showering.
 - New Bore currently RFQ. Two sites have been identified but still awaiting actual results from the well drillers.
 - Bore likely to be operational by July.
 - All tanks will be replaced by mid-July and several will be replaced within the next 2 weeks.

Regarding water collection options:

- 3 treatment points for all water collected, including roof water.
- Not relying on 1 collection point only.
- Regular maintenance programme.
- Currently old pipes are being dug out by and under B2. Repairs will be done block by block and outdated septic systems will be decommissioned.
- Secure work areas are being set up where the contractors are working.
- Fresh water reticulation will be a combination of above and below ground with some pipes being strapped under the A block deck.
- Alex has been given delegated authority to get this fixed to an extremely high standard.
 The Ministry are here to support the school and appreciates the support given by the school also.
- Hand sanitiser dispensers are to be fitted in all bathrooms around the school. Ministry will
 assist with covering costs of this.

Questions from the Board:

- The Waiheke community are asking if we have excrement in our drinking water. Is that what caused the contamination?
- Alex replied that the source of contamination has not been located but he does not believe excrement in the water to be the cause.
- Alex has written a press statement to the Gulf News today.
- The MOE will remain in close communication with both Jude and Trudie at all stages of the work.

The Board would like to thank Alex for his comprehensive outline of the work that is being proposed and being done now.
